

National Taiwan Normal University Graduate Institute of Mass Communication Criteria for the Foreign Language Proficiency Graduation Requirement

Foreign Language	Criteria	Remedial Measures or Exemptions
English	1. Receiving a Lexile reading measure of 750L from the NTNU English Proficiency Test 2. Passing the Intermediate Level of the General English Proficiency Test (GEPT) 3. Other English proficiency certificate with a score equivalent to CEFR B1 Level (e.g., TOEIC score of 550 or higher, TOEFL iBT score of 42 or higher, TOEFL ITP score of 457 or higher, IELTS score of 4.0 or higher)	1. Supplementary education courses: Completion of NTNU's online Beginner-to-Intermediate English Grammar Course 600L 2. An exemption from the graduation requirement criteria for foreign language proficiency may be granted for the completion of at least one professional course taught entirely in English offered by the Graduate Institute of Mass Communication or the College of International Studies and Social Sciences or the completion of a semester-long (or longer) exchange program in a non-Chinese speaking country.
Japanese	Passing the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT), N4 Level	
Korean	Passing the Test of Proficiency in Korean (TOPIK), Level 2 (Grade 2)	
	International students may choose to take the Test of Chinese as a Foreign Language (TOCFL) and are required to pass Level 4 on the reading comprehension exam.	International students may not choose to be assessed in their native language for the foreign language proficiency graduation requirement.

Note: These criteria are applicable to NTNU students enrolled in Academic Year 2011 and later.

According to the resolution passed during the 103rd Institute Affairs Meeting on December 12, 2019, students in the Graduate Institute of Mass Communication must have received their certificate for foreign language proficiency within the five years previous to enrolling in NTNU or during their course of study at the Graduate Institute.
