Eva Tsai is Professor at the Graduate Institute of Mass Communication, National Taiwan Normal University. Energized by Asia's dynamic movements between nations and localities since the 1990s, she has researched and published on TV and screen culture, stardom, fandom, popular music, and fashion trade in the inter-Asian contexts. Furthermore, her interests in journalism, cultural studies, and qualitative methods have led her to study how industries, institutions, and organizations impact cultural production. Relevant projects have included a study of the cultural struggles around her university, experimental writing on academic life, and the founding of a content incubation hub at her institute called Hoping Lab. In 2017, her career took a practitioner's turn. She made audio documentaries, taught narrative podcasting, and launched research to explain podcast innovation in Taiwan. At Hoping Lab, she produces and runs three podcast shows: an audio documentary, a music podcast, and a video and podcast program featuring the work by communication students. She is the co-editor of three research anthologies: Made in Taiwan: Studies in Popular Music (Routledge, 2020), Routledge Handbook of East Asia Popular Culture (Routledge, 2017), and Television, Japan, and Globalization (The University of Michigan Press, 2010). Eva was born in Salt Lake City, Utah and spent her childhood in southern Taipei near Taipei Zoo and the Maokong tea farms area. As a youth and young adult, she has lived in Gaithersburg, Berkeley, Los Angeles, and Iowa City. Her multi-sited research across Asia was carried out in Tokyo, Beijing, Seoul, Taipei, and Bangkok. She lives once again in southern Taipei and enjoys biking along Jingmei River and looking out over the Erge mountains.

Research Grants

Sound, Storytelling, and Sports Culture: A Practice-Based Research

Building on my previous podcast research as well as production experience, I am excited to go into this new project. With the digital content lab I co-founded at my institute, Hoping Lab, I will develop narrative and experimental audio pieces on relevant, diverse and critical stories about sports, society, and culture related to Taiwan. This two-year research project (2025.7.1~2027.6.30) is funded by the National Science and Technology Council (NSTC) of Taiwan.

Toward an Enterprising and Public Podcasting Service: Sound Media, Creative Economy, and Collaborative Actions

In this research, I tackled the question: How do we understand the podcast boom that took off in Taiwan around 2020? Talking with big and small, mainstream and alternative players in journalism, content industry, and non-for-profit fields, I wish to provide a critical and unique account on the development and meanings of audio podcast production. Musical Cosmopolitanism through Inter-Asia: Interactions between Thai and Taiwanese (Taiyu) Dance Pop Culture

This project, which involved a six-week fieldwork in Bangkok, investigates the moments that Thai popular music entered into Taiwanese popular music. The quick answer? Traces of Thai rock, lukthung, and mainstream pop are definitely present in local Taiwanese music. I produced two podcast series, Shida Stories and The Pop Culture Researcher, with the intent to utilize versatile audio material and formats to engage critically with the university cultural environment as well as the regional interactions under globalization. The 2.5-year project (2015.8~2018.1) was supported by the National Science Council of Taiwan 104-2410-H-003-125-MY2.

Hoping Lab, the content incubation lab I founded at my institute, received a News Digital Transformation Grant from the Taiwan News Digital Co-Prosperity Fund, a partnership between Google News Initiative and the Digital Transformation Association (DTA) (2024.2.5~2025.2.4).
